

### The History of the Hamburger

Where does the hamburger come from? Many people believe it started in Germany, in the town called "Hamburg". People there in fact used to eat something called a hamburger, but this original hamburger, was very different. To begin with, it had no bread and also, the meat was served uncooked. Cooking this meat and putting it between two pieces of bread started in America.

The hamburger is a more recent invention than the hotdog, by about 10 years, but the sandwich is the oldest invention of all. The first sandwich was the idea of an Englishman, the Earl of Sandwich in the 1700s. He asked his servants to put his meat between two pieces of bread because he did not want to stop playing cards when he was hungry. Also, with the bread, his hands didn't get dirty. If he had eaten meat without bread, his oily fingers would have ruined the cards.

No one knows for sure who made the first hamburger, but it was probably around the year 1900. There were many fairs at that time and people wanted a hot meal that they could eat while they were walking. The idea quickly became very popular. Of course, the most famous hamburger is the one made by McDonald's. The first McDonald restaurant opened in 1955 and now there are over 14,400 in the USA and 31,000 all over the world. They sell 75 burgers every second of the day!

One thing is for sure – people eat hamburgers in many different ways. It has become one of the world's most popular foods, especially with teenagers.
