Chuseok is one of the most important holidays in South Korea.

This festival lasts three days and it starts on the fifteenth day of the eighth lunar month. Before *Chuseok*, people go back to their hometowns to spend time with their families as well as their friends. In the morning of the first day of *Chuseok*, people wear *hanbok* and visit their older family members. During *Chuseok*, they eat traditional foods like *songpyeon* (rice cakes) and *jeon* (pancakes). Korean people also play many traditional games and activities during their Thanksgiving holidays. Traditional games like *talchum* (mask dancing), *ganggangsullae* (circle dancing), and *ssireum* (wrestling) are popular during *Chuseok*.
