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- Educational systems in Britain, the USA and the Czech Republic are to some extent similar.



- In the Czech Republic**, children go to right after **nursery school** (kindergarten).
- It is divided into 2 stages – the first stage is for pupils of age 6 to 11, and the second stage for pupils of age 12-15.
- Primary school is followed by three or four years of .



- In Britain** currently there is primary school for pupils of ages 5 to 11 and secondary school for pupils of ages 12 to 16 or 18.
- At the age of 18, students who want to go to university take , which are a type of **school-leaving exam**.
- Most of the children are educated in , which are paid by government.
- About 7 % of students attend independent schools, which are in Britain called . The most popular are in Eton, Harrow or Rugby.



- In the USA**, primary school is followed by , or more precisely .
- As well as in Britain, most of the students attend state schools, but they also have an option to attend an independent school, which is in the USA called .
