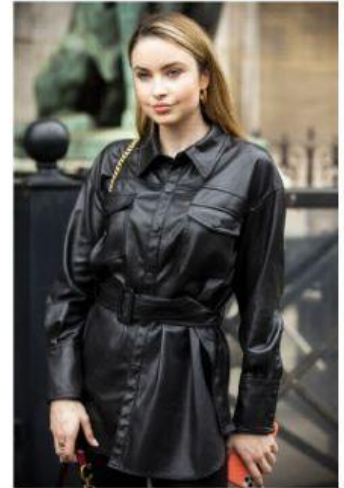


Modal verbs
