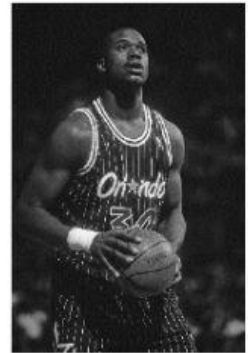
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B: READING COMPREHENSION

"A Good Reason to Look Up"



- 1 When I was in junior high school, what my friends thought of me was very
2 important to me. During those years, I grew much taller than most of my
3 peers. Being so tall made me feel uncomfortable. In order to keep the focus off
4 me and my usual height, I went along with the crowd who would play practical
5 jokes on the other kids at school. Being one of the class clowns gave me a way
6 to make sure that the jokes were directed at others, and not at me.
- 7 I would pull all kinds of pranks that were hurtful, and sometimes even harmful,
8 to others. I thought they were going to be funny, but it ended up that no one thought they were –
9 least of all my father.
- 10 My parents didn't always think that my behavior was funny. They reminded me about the Golden
11 Rule: to treat others as I would like to be treated. Many times, I was disciplined for the hurtful way I
12 was treating others. What I was doing was hurting my reputation as someone to be looked up to.
13 My friends were looking up to me because I was tall, but what did they see?
- 14 My parents wanted me to be a leader who was a good example to others- to be a decent human
15 being. They taught me to set my own goals, and to do the best at everything I set out to do. During
16 the lectures I got from my father, he told me over and over again to be the leader I was meant to
17 be- to be a big man in my heart and actions, as well as in my body.
18 I had to question myself whether or not it was important to me to be the kind of leader and person
19 my father believed I was inside. I knew in my heart that he was right, so I tried my best to follow my
20 father's advice.
- 21 Once I was focused on being the best I could be at basketball and became a leader in the game, I
22 took my responsibility to set a good example more seriously. I sometimes have to stop and think
23 before I act, and I make mistakes occasionally – everyone is human. But I continue to look for
24 opportunities where I can make a difference, and to set a good example because of my father's
25 advice. I now pass it on to you.
- 26 "Be a leader, Shaq, not a follower. Since people already have to look up to you, give them a reason
27 to do so."
