

Commas in a Series of Verbs

- A **comma** tells a reader where to pause. A comma also helps to make the meaning of a sentence clear.
- When you list three or more words together in a sentence, the list is called a **series**. Use commas to separate verbs in a series, just as you do with nouns.

The children laughed, jumped, and shouted because it was recess time. They talked, sang, and cheered.
