

Past Continuous (Betty Azar Chapter 2-10: PG28)

NOTE:

EXAMPLE #1: I **was walking** down the street when it began to rain.

There are two actions above – 1 – I **was walking** down the street

-2- It **began** to rain

Both actions occurred at the same time, but *one action began earlier and was in progress when the other action happened.*

EXAMPLE #2: At 8 o'clock last night, I **was studying**.

My studying began before 8, was in progress at that time and probably continued after.

EXAMPLE #3: While I **was studying** in my room, my brother

was watching TV in the living room.

Sometimes, the past continuous is used in both parts of a sentence when two actions are happening at the same time
