Countable and uncountable nouns

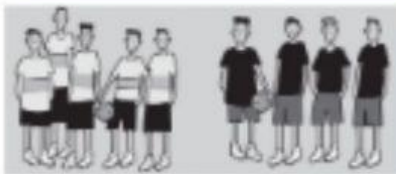
(with *is / isn't enough, are / aren't enough, is too much, are too many*)

We use *too many* and *are / aren't enough* with countable nouns, and *too much* and *is / isn't enough* with uncountable nouns. We use these to talk about our opinion of the quantity of something.
