Parentheses () are used to enclose additional, non-essential information to clarify, explain, or add a side note in a sentence. Use parentheses to prevent disrupting the flow of a sentence. Another use of parentheses is to enumerate a list.

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Semi-colons ;

Rule 1—Use a semi-colon to separate two related sentences.

Formula = Full sentence ; full sentence. Ex—I love going to the beach; it is the most peaceful place that I know.

Rule 2—Use a semi-colon with a dependent marker word, such as—however, moreover, therefore, consequently, furthermore. Formula= Full sentence ; marker word , full sentence.
