## FIRST CONDITIONAL

### FORM:

**If + Present Simple- modal (will) + infinitive**

E.g.: If **you join** the club, **you'll do** a lot of fun activities.

### USE:

Conditions which are real and certain or probable in the present or future.



If Mary cleans her room, she  
\_\_\_\_\_ (go) to the cinema.



If you need a pencil, I  
\_\_\_\_\_ (lend) you mine..



If you \_\_\_\_\_ (finish your homework), If arrive early, I  
you can go out and play. \_\_\_\_\_ (give) him a call.



If you \_\_\_\_\_ (want) I talk  
to him.



If I see her, I \_\_\_\_\_ (send)  
her your love.



If you \_\_\_\_\_ (finish) on  
time, we will go to the  
beach.



You will be late if you

He will watch TV tonight if  
he \_\_\_\_\_ (not/ go out)
