


## ONCE UPON A TIME

SIMILARITIES	DIFFERENCES in FANTASY
Title	Sometimes the titles are fantastic
Author	Could have author or there might be a narrator
Opening	Once there was.....There was a time....
Plot	Always use magic or supernatural events
Characters (Real)	Characters could be talking animals, or people with powers
Setting	The location <u>or</u> <u>place</u> might be real or unrealistic
Closing ( <u>Ending</u> )	Generally a happy ending
