Kinds of Adjectives

This Learning Activity Sheet is about identifying the kinds of adjectives. This LAS aims to hone the skills of the pupils in speaking, writing and grammar. At the end of this LAS, it is expected that pupils will be able to use effectively the competencies mentioned above.

KINDS OF ADJECTIVES

- Are words that describe or tell something about nouns.
- It has two types: **Descriptive Adjectives** and **Numeral Adjectives**.

Read the sentences below.

DESCRIPTIVE ADJECTIVES

- Adjectives are words that gives description or describes the quality or characteristics of noun.

The **shoes** is **expensive**.
noun descriptive adj.



Expensive is a descriptive adjective.
It describes the quality of the shoes.



The **woman** is **pretty**.
noun descriptive adj.

Pretty is a descriptive adjective.
It describes the woman's beauty as pretty.

NUMERAL ADJECTIVES


- Is an adjective that tells us about how many or how much or in what order the noun is in. There are two kinds of numeral adjectives:

A. Definite numeral adjectives – refers to exact number of nouns.

The **first** boy in the line is **Caerwyn**.
Numeral adj. noun




The **three** **little** **pigs** eat rice bran.
Numeral adj. noun



First and **three** are definite numeral adjectives because it tells the exact number of the boy and pigs.

B. Indefinite numeral adjectives – tells the number of noun without saying precisely what the number is.

I want **few** **apples** as my snacks.
Indefinite adj. noun



Several attended the online class.
Indefinite adj. noun




Few and **several** are indefinite numeral adjectives. It tells the number of noun but not specific.
