Elements of the anecdotes:

Setting	Setting is a description of where and when the story takes place.
Characters	A character is a person, animal, being, creature, or thing in a story. Writers use characters to perform the actions and speak dialogue. <b>Main character:</b> These are the most important characters in the story. <b>Secondary characters:</b> They are not as important as the main characters, but still play a large part in the story. Their actions help drive the story forward.
Author	The person who writes the anecdote
