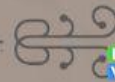
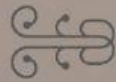
Between 1885 and 1895, Conan Doyle wrote twenty-five short stories about Sherlock Holmes. He didn't want to write any more, so in the final story – The Final Problem – Holmes dies.

But lots of people loved the Sherlock Holmes stories and they were very sad and angry about his death. So Conan Doyle changed his mind and brought Holmes back to life. He continued writing Sherlock Holmes stories for another twenty-five years!

In the stories, Sherlock Holmes lived at 221b Baker Street in London. Today, there's a museum at that address. When it opened, it was the world's first museum about a fictional character.

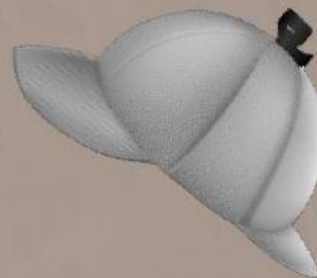
