IV. Read the text.

What did Bradley's mum do when he didn't answer his phone?

Do you always answer the phone when your mom call or do you ignore it? You may not be able to do that for much longer. A mother from Houston, USA, Sharon Standifird, was annoyed because she was unable to get her teenagers to answer the phone. So she did a search online. She didn't know much about app **development** but, with some help, she created the app. It's **on sale** and it's called 'Ignore No More'. What does the app do? If you don't answer your mum's call, the phone locks. This means that you can't go onto Facebook, or play games, or text, or call anyone else. The only thing you can do is call your mum. However, the app **allow** you to make an **emergency** phone call.

All your mum or dad has to do is to find your number on their phone, then they type in a password and your phone is 'blocked' — it doesn't work. You have to call your mum.
