## Comparisons with *as . . . as*

The frog	is	as	big	as	my hand.
Lions	aren't		fast		cheetahs.

*as . . . as* = The two things are the same.

*not as . . . as* = The two things are different.

3. Cheetahs can run at a speed of around 110 kph (68 mph). Sailfish can swim 110 kph.

4. A baby elephant is big! It weighs about 90 kg (200 lb.), the same as two small people.
