Future forms

We often use **will**

- to make decisions while we're speaking
- to make promises and offers to help somebody
- to make predictions based on our own opinions.

We often use **going to**

- to talk about plans that we made earlier
- to make predictions based on evidence.

We often use the **present continuous**

- to talk about fixed arrangements for specific future dates / times.

- 1 I can't come out on Friday evening. the night shift.
- 2 So? Have you decided? What for the job interview tomorrow?
- 3 Our sales director to our office tomorrow for a big meeting, so we all need to be there.
- 4 They've offered me the job, and I've accepted it. So tomorrow my boss that I'm leaving!
- 5 A: I'm pleased to say we've decided to offer you the job.
B: Really? Oh great. it.
- 6 A: I'm thinking of resigning, but it's still a secret.
B: Don't worry – anyone.
