

GRAMMAR PRESENT, PAST and FUTURE TENSES NOTES



The <u>tense</u> of a verb shows the time of the action, or when something happens. For example: <u>past tense</u>, <u>present tense</u> or <u>future tense</u>.

PAST TENSE:

Verbs in the **past tense** show action that has already happened. TIP: Most of these verbs end in *ed*.

Example: Jermaine washed the dog yesterday.

PRESENT TENSE:

Verbs in the present tense show action that happens now.

<u>TIP:</u> Most present tense singular verbs end with \underline{s} or \underline{es} . Most present tense singular verbs do not end with \underline{s} or \underline{es} .

Example: Jermaine washes the dog, while his friends play catch.

Present tense singular verb

Present tense plural verb

FUTURE TENSE:

Verbs in the future tense show action that will happen.

TIP: Add will or shall to most verbs to show the future tense.

Example: Jermaine will wash the dog.

TIP: Irregular verbs change spelling to form past tense.

Example: fly/ flew; eat/ate; write/wrote; tell/told, meet/met, etc.

TENSE TABLE

| PAST | PRESENT | FUTURE |
|------------------|-----------------------|-------------------|
| Mom worked | She works | She will work |
| The girls danced | They dance | We will dance |
| received | We receive | We shall receive |
| You called | He calls | They will call |
| The girl sang | The choirs sing | The men will sing |
| Jade traveled | Jade and Tiara travel | You will travel |
