

Parents: This week, we will be focussing on recounts. A recount text is a piece of writing that gives details of an event that has happened. Recount texts can come in the form of diary entries, newspaper articles and letters, and usually have the following features:

- Written in chronological order
- Written in the first person (diaries and letters)
- Written in the past tense
- Use time connectives

Children will usually be asked to write a recount about something exciting and memorable that has happened, or may be asked to imagine themselves as a character in a book and write a recount of an important event that has occurred in the story.
