Tenses: In grammar the word **Tenses** refers to the **Time** when something happens.

When things happen at different times we change the verb to indicate when something happened like the word “eat” being changed into the word “ate”.

There are Four basic kinds of **Tenses:**

The Simple Tense: Used for everyday occurrences

The Progressive Tense: Used for a process that takes a while

The Perfect Tense: Used when one thing happens before another

The Perfect Progressive Tense: Used when one process happens before another

Each Tense has three Variations **Past, Future and Present.**

The Simple Past Tense:

Exam Question 1: When do we use the Simple Past?

Exam Answer 1: When something happened at a specific time in the past.

Example: Yesterday, I ate lunch.

Exam Question 2: What happens to the verb in the Simple Past?

Exam Answer 2: The verb is changed into the past participle form.

Examples: “Eat” becomes “Ate”, Walk becomes “Walked”, “Drink” becomes “Drank”.

The Simple Present Tense

Exam Question 3: When do we use the Simple Present Tense?

Exam Answer 3: We use the Simple Present Tense when something happens every day or in the usual way or when something just happens to be true.

Example: I play games on my smartphone every day. (Everyday)

Example: The sun is hot. (True)

Exam Question 4: What happens to the verb in the Simple Present?

Exam Answer 4: Nothing- we use the base form of the verb for the Simple Present Tense.

Example: “Eat” stays “Eat”, “Walk” stays “Walk”, “drink” stays “Drink”

The Simple Future Tense:

Exam Question 4: When do we use the Simple Future Tense?

Exam Answer 4: We use the Simple Future Tense to make a prediction or give a warning, or when we make a spontaneous (on the spot) decision.

Exam Question 5: What happens to the verb in the Simple Future Tense?

Exam Answer 5: In the Simple Future Tense we add the word “Will” in front of the base form of the verb.

Example: “Walk” becomes “will walk”, “eat” becomes “will eat”, “drink” becomes “will drink”

Time Words: tomorrow, next week, on [any future date], in [x] (days, weeks, months, years), the day after tomorrow.

The Past Progressive Tense:

Exam Question 1: When do we use the Past Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 1: When something started in the past and took a while to finish.

Example: While you were reading I was daydreaming.

Exam Question 2: What happens to the verb in the Past Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 2: The verb has the words was/were added in front of it and has the “-ing” suffix added behind it.

Examples: “Eat” becomes “was/were eating”, “Walk” becomes “was/were walking”, “Drink” becomes “was/were drinking”.

The Present Progressive Tense

Exam Question 3: When do we use the Present Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 3: We use the Present Progressive Tense when something is happening *right now*. It started in the past, it continues now, and will finish in the future.

Example: Right now, I am reading this sentence.

Example: At this moment we are learning about the present progressive tense.

Exam Question 4: What happens to the verb in the Present Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 4: We add am/is/are in front of the verb, and “-ing” behind it.

Examples: “Eat” becomes “am/is/are eating”, “Walk” becomes “am/is/are walking”, “Drink” becomes “am/is/are drinking”.

Time Words: Right now, at this moment, at present.
