### Did you know?

The future with "going to" is used to **express events you have already planned in the future and your intentions for the future**. We sometimes also use the present continuous for planned events in the near future.

### Remember

We sometimes also use the present continuous for planned events in the near future.

### Curious fact...

The future tense with going to, also **simple future**, expresses a logical prediction for the future or an intention or plan which has already been decided. This tense is constructed with: be + going to + infinitive.
