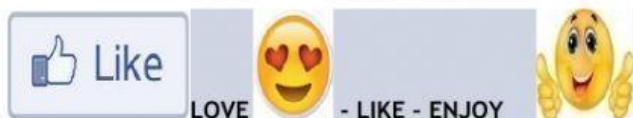


“LIKES & DISLIKES +ING”

Like/Love/Hate/Not Mind/Can't stand + ing. The verbs **love**, **like**, enjoy, **dislike**, not **mind**, can't stand and **hate** are verbs which express likes and dislikes. They are usually followed by a gerund (verb + **-ing**) when the meaning is general.



I like getting up early in the summer.

My brother Sean loves skydiving.

We enjoy spending our Christmas holidays in the Southern Alps.

They hate watching horror films.

I don't mind watching horror films

She can't stand listening to classical music.

She doesn't mind helping with the house chores.
