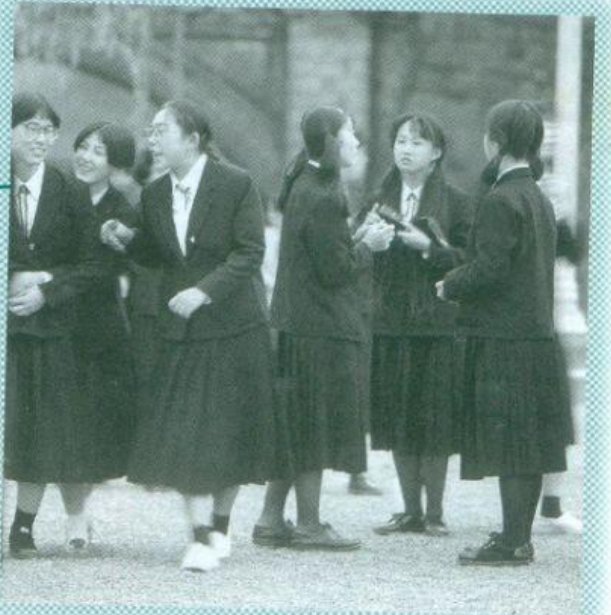

School Uniforms

In many countries, like Britain and Japan, wearing school uniforms is still a **tradition**, but in others, like the United States, France, and Germany, uniforms are not so **common**.

- 5 Some people say that uniforms are important. Uniforms help students learn to **obey rules** and learn to study better. They make all the students **equal** in **appearance**. They also help students feel like part of the school.

Other people **disagree**. They say that uniforms are **uncomfortable** and **unattractive**. Most importantly, they say that when students wear uniforms, they can't express themselves with their clothes.

- 10 Some students think uniforms can be attractive. Some school students make small changes to their uniforms because they want to look more fashionable. They use their uniforms as a way to express themselves. Some students try to attend the school with the best uniform. This is a different way to look at uniforms. An old
