## Simple past: regular verbs



## Super Grammar

Use the simple past to talk about something that happened in the past at a specific time:

*She played football yesterday.*

Regular verbs in the simple past are verbs which end in *-ed*, such as *played*, *watched* and *visited*. They are the same for every person: *I, you, he, she, we, you, they*.

1 Put the verbs into the simple past.

Hi Jen,

Is your arm better? I hope so. Last week was the half-term holiday. No school – brilliant! On Monday I <sup>1</sup> *played* (play) basketball with my cousins. What a game! On Friday I <sup>6</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (stay) at home because I was a bit tired. At the weekend, it was really sunny. I <sup>7</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (help) my parents in the garden. I really <sup>8</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ (like) my half-term holiday! How was your week, Jen?
