Beginning with two artists, _____ and _____, the **Cubism** was all about geometric shapes, and multiple perspectives. All the rules of traditional western painting were rejected.

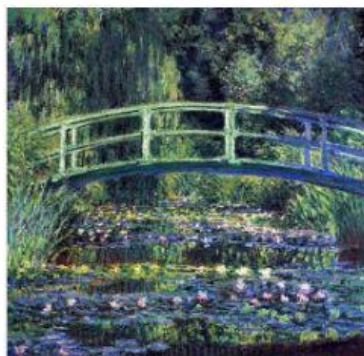
