

ADJECTIVES

ADJECTIVES are describing words. They tell about a noun or pronoun.

Adjectives Tell:

WHAT KIND: *sharp · furry · freckled · cruel · plastic · ragged*

The cat had sharp claws.
We take plastic spoons on our picnic.

WHICH ONE (S): *this · that · these · those*

That truck is new.
These mittens are soft.

HOW MANY: *six · eight · few · many · several · hundred*

Several boys were in line.
John read eight books during the summer.

Articles:

ARTICLES are a special type of adjective.
a · an · the

Hand me the paper.
Please give me a book.

Comparing:

ADJECTIVES can compare nouns and pronouns to each other.
taller · steepest · best · worst · earlier

She is taller than you.
We walked up the steepest hill.
