

A simple sentence has only one verb.

Example: The dragon <u>lives</u> in the water.

Simple sentence can be joined together using joining words to make a compound sentence.

Compound sentence is made up of two simple sentences

Joined with and, but, so, or or.

Example: The dragon <u>lives</u> in the water and <u>flies</u> in the air.
