

passive or active

The passive is a way of structuring a sentence so that the grammatical subject is the person or thing which experiences the effect of an action, rather than the person or thing which causes the effect:

- ✚ The cat was chased by the dog.
- ✚ The house will be built shortly.
- ✚ This book was written by Jane Austen.
- ✚ The cake has been eaten. (no agent)

An active verb or sentence is one in which the subject is the person or thing which performs the stated action:

- ✚ The dog chased the cat.
- ✚ The builders will build the house shortly.
- ✚ Jane Austen wrote this book.
- ✚ They have eaten the cake.
