Para hacer wh- questions primero ponemos la wh- word que indica qué información concreta queremos saber, y luego el resto de la oración en forma interrogativa. Ejemplos:

AFFIRMATIVE	YES/NO QUESTION	WH-QUESTION
She was sick <u>yesterday</u> .	Was she sick yesterday?	When was she sick?
He's got <u>three</u> cats.	Has he got three cats?	How many cats has he got?
I had <u>some</u> questions.	Did you have <u>any</u> questions?	How many questions did you have?
He lives <u>in London</u> .	Does he live in London?	Where does he live?
She's bought <u>a book</u> .	Has she bought a book?	What has she bought?
He'll travel <u>by train</u> .	Will he travel by train?	How will he travel?
<u>You</u> 're going to have a lot of problems.	Am I going to have a lot of problems?	Who's going to have a lot of problems?
