Transitive Verb	Intransitive Verb
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Transitive verbs are action verbs that have an object to receive that action.</li><li>• <i>I <b>bake</b> some cookies.</i></li><li>• <i>I <b>ride</b> the bicycle.</i></li><li>• <i>I <b>move</b> the chair.</i></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Intransitive verbs are action verbs but unlike transitive verbs, they do not have an object receiving the action.</li><li>• <i>I <b>laugh</b>.</i></li><li>• <i>I <b>cry</b>.</i></li><li>• <i>The <b>book</b> falls.</i></li></ul>
