The closed season gives the Nassau grouper a chance to reproduce. The more fish that successfully spawn now, the more fish there will be for us to catch and eat later.
Please support our Bahamian fishermen and enjoy other fish with your peas 'n rice during the closed season.

The over fishing of the Nassau grouper is common because they gather in predictable places in order to mate and spawn. This makes them an easy target for fishermen. Catching the fish at this time lessens the number of grouper we will have to eat and will threaten the likelihood of people enjoying grouper in the future.

HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP:

- Do not catch, buy or sell Nassau grouper during the closed season. Violators can be fined or jailed.
- Do not eat Nassau grouper during the closed season. Red snappers and Jacks make excellent boiled fish.
