## If + present simple, present simple

If clause

result clause

### 1. For general truths

Ex: *Ice melts if you heat it.*

### 2. For instructions

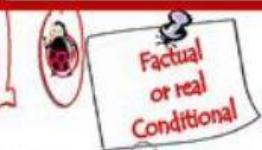
Ex: *If you press the button, it turns on.*

### 3. Habits and daily routines

Ex: *If I drink, I never drive.*



You can also think of it this way.



## If + present continuous, simple present

If clause

result clause

*If I am driving, I never answer my mobile phone.*

*When I'm reading, my cat sits on my laptop.*

You can use **modals** in the result clause:

Ex: *If I don't have my glasses, I **can't** drive.*

*If you want to pass the exam, you **must** study hard.*

You can also use the **imperative** in the result clause:

Ex: *If you drink, **don't** drive.*

*If you fail the exam, **study more!***

*I always smoke **when** I drink.*

*When I'm sad, I go shopping.*



*I can't drive **unless** I have my glasses.*

*You can't drive a car **unless** you have a license.*

**Unless** can be used instead of **if not**

If the conditional comes first, you need a comma.

You don't need a comma if the conditional doesn't come first.
