

S O AND SUCH

SO + ADJECTIVE/ADVERB

- He spoke **so fast** that we didn't understand him
- She arrived **so late** that everybody had gone

SO + MANY/MUCH + NOUN

- She drinks **so much coffee** that she can never sleep
- I have bought **so many things** that I am broke now

SUCH + (ADJECTIVE) + NOUN

- He says **such stupid things** that nobody believes him
- I live in **such a big house** that I always feel alone
