

## CLAUSES OF CONTRAST AND PURPOSES

1) *Although he's the CEO, he goes to work by bike. (DESPITE)*

**Despite**

2) *Their products sell well Although they don't do any marketing. (IN SPITE OF)*

**Their products sell well**

3) *Is that machine to make juice? (FOR)*

**Is that a machine**

4) *They reduced their prices so as to sell more products. (SO THAT)*

**They reduced**

5) *Despite the fact that I was very late, my boss wasn't angry. (ALTHOUGH)*

**Although**

6) *I couldn't sleep. I was very tired. (DESPITE)*

**I couldn't**

7) *We played quiet well, we lost the game (IN SPITE OF)*

**In spite of**

8) *She attends to a course. She wants to learn to play chess. (TO)*

**She attends**

9) *You must take your umbrella so that you won't get wet. ((IN ORDER )*

**You**

10) *They came to the party. They hadn't been invited. (EVEN THOUGH)*

**They came**

11) *I will come with you. I want to help you. (IN ORDER TO)*

**I will**

12) *He reads a book every month so as to increase his vocabulary. (SO THAT)*

**He reads**

13) *Although she is the managing director, she doesn't have her own office. (DESPITE)*

**Despite**

14) *She wrote my cellphone number so that she wouldn't forget it. (SO AS )*

**She wrote**

15) *I enjoyed the movie. The story was silly. (DESPITE)*

**I enjoyed**

16) *He kept the door open. He wanted to let fresh air in. (SO AS TO)*

**He kept**

17) *Peter reached the peak. He was exhausted. (EVEN THOUGH)*

**Peter**

18) *He's not very successful although he works very hard. (IN SPITE OF)*

**He's not very successful**
