

## After, before, when time **clause** in the **future tense**

A **clause** is a dependent sentence. It has subject + verb. After / before / when + a clause is a time clause. In the future tense, the verb form in a time clause is always in simple present. For example:

Time clause verb in present simple form	Main sentence verb: will/be going to + verb
1) After I <b>finish</b> my homework, After he <b>finishes</b> his homework,	→ I <b>will watch</b> TV. → He <b>will watch</b> TV.
2) Before I <b>cook</b> dinner, Before she <b>cooks</b> dinner,	→ I <b>will have</b> talk to my mother. → she <b>will talk</b> to her mother.
3) When I <b>have</b> money, When he <b>has</b> money,	→ I <b>will buy</b> a computer. → he <b>will buy</b> a computer.
