







After, before, when time clause in the **future tense**

A **clause** is a dependent sentence. It has subject + verb. After / before / when + a clause is a time clause. In the future tense, the verb form in a time clause is always in simple present. For example:

Time clause verb in present simple form	Main sentence verb: will/be going to + verb
1) After I finish my homework,  I will watch TV. After he finishes his homework,  He will watch TV.	
2) Before I cook dinner,  I will have talk to my mother. Before she cooks dinner,  she will talk to her mother.	
3) When I have money,  I will buy a computer. When he has money,  he will buy a computer.
