study suggests that classrooms are another popular place. The study, presented recently at the American Public							
Health Association's yearly meeting in Philadelphia, is based on the results of the research from more than 10,							
000 middle school students v	who answered questions on	line.					
Of those researched, 43% said they'd been physically bullied within the last month. A bit more than half said they							
had been <u>laughed at</u> in an unfriendly way, and half reported being called hurtful names. About one third said							
groups had excluded them to	hurt their feelings.28% sa	aid their belongings had be	een taken or broken; 21% said				
someone had threatened to hurt them. According to the results, two-thirds of the students said they had been bullied							
in more than one way over the previous month.
