

### Cyber Bullying

Everyone knows that electronic technology such as mobile phones, computers and tablets has improved communication and entertainment. However, it has also encouraged cyber bullying, which has become a very serious problem nowadays, especially among teenagers.

There are different kinds of cyber bullying. Some young bullies prefer to send rude messages or threats to another young person's email or mobile phone. Other bullies may share personal and private information, pictures or videos about another young person on social networking sites such as Facebook or Twitter. They can also post lies about their victims or keep them out of chat websites. What is worse, some bullies may pretend to be someone else online to hurt another person.

For many reasons, cyber bullying can be worse than traditional bullying. This is because cyber bullies can invade their victims' home through a computer or mobile phone at any time of the day, so they have no way to escape. In addition, because online bullies are often anonymous, the victims can feel more fear as they have no idea who is doing this to them. Finally, nasty messages and images cannot be deleted once they have been posted online; on the contrary, they will always be there for many people to see.

However, just as in traditional bullying, cyber bullying can make its victims lose confidence in themselves or feel alone. This can be very painful because friends are important at this age. A lot of cyber bullying victims may skip school to avoid facing their bullies. As a result, their grades go down as it is difficult for them to concentrate on their studies. Finally, they may decide to take revenge and become bullies themselves.

To sum up, technology may benefit young people, but in order for them to enjoy its benefits, both teenagers and adults should be aware of the problems cyber bullying causes and find ways to fight it.


