



Like, love, don't like, hate +ing

We can use *like*, *don't like*, *love*, *hate* and *don't mind* + *ing* to say *how we feel about an activity*.

I like going to the park, She loves playing games, They hate cleaning.

Love means = it's great!. Like means = it's good. Don't mind means = it's OK.
Don't like means = it's bad. Hate means = it's really bad!

After *love*, *like*, *don't mind*, *don't like* and *hate*, we usually use the verb with *ing*.



I like + verb -ing

I like swimming.



I love + verb -ing

I love doing aerobics.



I don't like + verb -ing

I don't like playing football.



I hate + verb -ing

I hate skateboarding.



We love using the computer.



I like cooking.



She doesn't mind studying.



He doesn't like shopping.



They hate going to the dentist.
