

Prefixes (re- and un-)

Rule:

A prefix is a word part added to the beginning of a word. Prefixes change the meaning of the base word.

The prefix **re-** means again. For example: **retie** = to tie again

The prefix **un-** makes the word mean the opposite of the base word.

Example: **untie** = the opposite of tie
