K-POP boy band KimChee will hold a virtual concert later this month to meet fans across the world.

The concert, titled "IN-SECURE" will take place at 6 p.m. on Jan. 23. It will be the second virtual event by the 11-member group following a live-streamed fan meeting held in August last year.

The self-producing band plans to perform over 20 songs from their albums. The concert will be broadcast with not only one, but four cameras, to allow viewers to watch it from four different angles at the same time.

A small town in northern Kedah experienced hailstorm on Wednesday. Instead of running for shelter, many residents in Changlun picked their phones, took videos and uploaded them online.

FEB 22: Customs authorities in Ohio said a dog helped them to stop a shipment of cereal which contained a surprise – firecrackers.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers in Cincinnati reported finding 20 kilograms of firecrackers that had been shipped from South America to a Hong Kong address.

Officials said an explosive detection dog named Bico was checking out incoming cargo from Peru on 13 February when he alerted officers to the package.

An analysis published in the journal, *Plus Medicine*, showed that a 3% increase of green area in children's home environment can raise their IQ score by 2.6 points on average.

Along with brain power, the researchers also found that being close to Mother Nature is also associated with fewer behavioural problems like the difficulty to concentrate and aggressiveness.

Surge in Screen Time

The Internet (0) gives children and adolescents access to an almost endless supply of information and opportunity for interaction. Hours can (9) pass by as they play games, watch videos or chat on social media platforms. Not surprisingly, their Internet usage has risen (10) sharply in many places during the coronavirus pandemic. A recent study (11) from Germany found that weekday gaming increased 75% in April this year, four weeks into Europe's coronavirus lockdown, compared with September 2019.



"Many of the gamers want to (12) escape reality or relieve stress this way," write the authors of the representative study carried out by German Centre for Addiction Research in Childhood and Adolescence. "These are early warning (13) signals that computer game addiction could grow due to the coronavirus." (14) Moreover, a good option is to apply time rules. We have the following guidelines; a half-an hour screen time daily for children under age five, and an hour for children aged five to nine. For children over the age of nine you've got to be more (15) firm. You could say 10 minutes daily per year of age, or one hour weekly per year of age.

On the positive side, the Internet (16) provides wonderful learning and information opportunities. There are as many benefits as there are challenges. It does both parents and children good to (17) turn down for a while and be offline. This is also important as studies also show that children and adolescents want their parents' (18) undivided attention now and then. Kids are in fact always receptive to parents' suggestions that don't have to do with digital media so it's relatively easy to pry them away from their screens.

The more I cleaned and cooked, the more I disliked her. Finally, I burst out to my mother and she told me to count my blessings. At that point, her advice made me angry. How could I count my blessings when my life was in ruins? She pointed out that my mother-in-law's presence at home meant that I could go to work in peace, knowing that someone was around to mind the children and keep an eye on things. With the extra income came more financial freedom. I could afford to buy things I was

unable to before my mother-in-law came into my life. It was true. So, I learned to let her into my life and eventually surrendered my kitchen to her.

Another favourite piece of advice that my mother loved to convey was 'let go and let God'. In school, I could not cope with examination pressures and whenever she saw me being so anxious, she would say, 'Relax, my dear. Let go and let God.' The Name Behind FashionValet

When Vivy Yusuf was 7 years old, she would make bracelets behind her desk while everyone else was paying attention to the teacher in class. These bracelets would be samples that she would then show her friends before making them take custom orders. "This became way more interesting than school itself, and I paid less attention to class," Vivy recalled, "But no one could scold me, because I was a good student."

27 [] She knew that she wanted to take A-Levels, but there was a problem. She took issue with the huge 9-month gap in between SPM and A-Levels. Because she hated the thought of doing nothing during the gap, she negotiated with, and convinced, her high school in KL and her college in the UK to let her do both simultaneously.

"I promised them that if I got bad results, they could kick me out," Vivy shared.
28 [] With that promise in mind, she studied hard and got straight A's for both exams.

She is also an opportunist. Based on a concept she learned from websites like ASOS and Net-a-Porter, Vivy started FashionValet with her then-friend, now-husband, Fadzarudin Shah Anuar, in 2010. They noticed a gap in the online shopping industry in Malaysia, and that the local designers were not able to reach out to potential buyers. 29 [] So, they started out with a shared fund of RM100,000.

To begin their business, they simply Googled "how to start an online shopping website" and called the first website developer they found. 30 [] "Naturally, I told them, 'You will do it in 1 month,'" Vivy shared, describing herself as "stubborn, determined, and very impatient". And they actually completed it on time, thanks to Vivy calling them every single day.

However, Vivy admitted that her entrepreneurial journey was filled with challenges. 31 [] There was a time when she didn't have enough money in the bank to pay salaries. Once, FashionValet's website went down for a week due to a system failure. There was also a moment when they couldn't get any funding.

Despite all that, she still kept going, and FashionValet now has an international presence, shipping to 40 to 50 countries daily. 32 [] "Deep down, I know the 7-year-old me isn't impressed yet. Being who we are, we will always be working for more, pushing boundaries, shattering glass ceiling," she added.
