If + simple present, simple present

If + simple present, will/can/may/imperative

*You **will have** a good time if you **go** to the party

If you **see** John, tell him to **call** me.

If + past simple → would/could/might + 1st type

If we **won** the lotto, we **could go** on holiday.

*We **could go** on holiday if we **won** the lotto.

If I **were** you, I'd **see** a doctor.

*I'd **see** a doctor if I **were** you.
