

# Activity verbs.

Concept	Type of verb
A verb that takes a direct object.	Lexical verbs
A verb that does not take a direct object.	Transitive verbs
They give real information. They do not rely on other words to convey their meanings. They are also termed the main verb or full verbs.	DE Lexical verbs
Have very little meaning of their own. They rely on the following noun to convey clear meanings.	Ergative verb
The verb that can be either transitive or intransitive	Intransitive verbs

I <b>can</b> learn English. I <b>must</b> clean my room.	Helping/auxiliary verb.
She <b>looks</b> sad. I <b>feel</b> happy	Irregular verbs.
Wash- washed- washed. Live- lived- lived. Enjoy- enjoyed- enjoyed.	Modal verbs
