 Comparative adjectives
 as + adjective + as

Aim

To practice comparative adjectives and the 'as + adjective + as' comparative structure.

Preparation

Make one copy of the two-page worksheet for each student.

Level

Intermediate (B1)

Time

30 minutes

Introduction

Here is a comparatives worksheet to help students practice comparative adjectives and the 'as + adjective + as' comparative structure.

Procedure

Give each student a copy of the two-page worksheet.

Students begin with a gap-fill exercise where they complete sentences with the comparative form of the adjectives in brackets.

Exercise A - Answer key

1. larger	5. funnier	9. more dangerous

Next, the students choose the correct answers in a set of comparative sentences.

Exercise B - Answer key

Students then move on to practice the 'as + adjective + as' comparative structure by writing negative comparative sentences that have the same meaning as the sentences shown.

Exercise C - Answer key

1. Mariah isn't as famous as Beyonce.
2. I'm not as lucky as my mother.
3. Dogs aren't as energetic as puppies.
4. He isn't as lazy as his cousin.
5. The other film isn't as strange as this one.
6. Cows aren't as clean as pigs.

Next, use the example to demonstrate the possible 'as + adjective + as' comparative sentences students can make, e.g. Rome isn't as modern as Shanghai. Shanghai is as modern as Rome, etc. Then, have the students write sentences, giving their opinion. When the students have finished, check their sentences as a class.
