Comparative Form of Adjectives and Adverbs (When **comparing 2**: persons, things, ideas, situations, or animals):

- Add **-er** at the end of **one-syllable** and **some two-syllable** adjectives or adverbs:

*hot – hott**er**

happy – happier**

**double the last consonant when preceded by vowel*

***change the ending -y for -i then add -er*

- Add **'more'** before **some two-syllable** and **three or more syllables** adjectives/adverbs. For example:

quickly – **more** quickly

difficult – **more** difficult

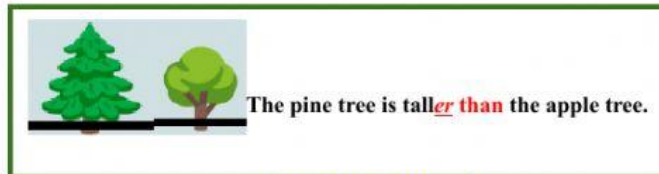
⇒ In sentences, we usually add the word **'than'** after the comparative form of the adjective or adverb. Example:

-He is taller **than** his brother.

-She drives **more** carefully **than** her husband.

⇒ Some adjectives and adverbs have an **irregular** comparative forms:

<u>Adjective/Adverb</u>	<u>Comparative Form</u>	<u>Adjective/Adverb</u>	<u>Comparative Form</u>
good -	better	bad -	worse
well -	better	badly -	worse
far -	farther/further	much -	more
little -	less
