

Sights and attractions of Vienna

Match the famous sights or attractions with their description.

1	St. Stephen's Cathedral	A	Vienna's Imperial Palace was originally a medieval castle; Austria's resplendent cultural heritage, home base of the Habsburgs from 1273 to 1918; now houses the Austrian president's offices and many museums
2	Prater	B	a unique mixture of Austrian traditions and oriental influences dating back to the 16th century
3	Danube Tower	C	neo-Renaissance building, Vienna's foremost opera and ballet venue
4	Spanish Riding School	D	the Habsburgs' overwhelmingly opulent summer palace is now a Unesco World Heritage site. It has got 1441 rooms, 40 are open to the public; including the private apartments of Franz Josef and Sisi
5	State Opera	E	a remarkable ensemble of museums, cafes, restaurants and bars inside former imperial stables; get an insight into Viennese cultural life; the perfect place to hang out and watch or meet people on warm evenings
6	Schönbrunn Zoo	F	the world's foremost children's choral group; among the oldest of all musical organizations, founded in 1498
7	Vienna Boys' Choir	G	a magnificent view over Vienna from the top of the tower, you can also eat in the restaurant ; it's 352 meters high and was built within 20 months!
8	Naschmarkt	H	massive public park, which also contains one of the world's oldest amusement parks
9	Museumsquartier	I	world's oldest and only baroque zoo; situated in the south-eastern part of the Habsburgs' summer residence, built in 1760; the keeping of animals after their specific requirements and thus have many babies
10	Schönbrunn Palace	K	Vienna's Gothic masterpiece cathedral with a giant gate and two towers; built in the 12th century
11	Hofburg	L	the oldest and last Riding School in the world where classic dressage is still practiced; founded in 1572
