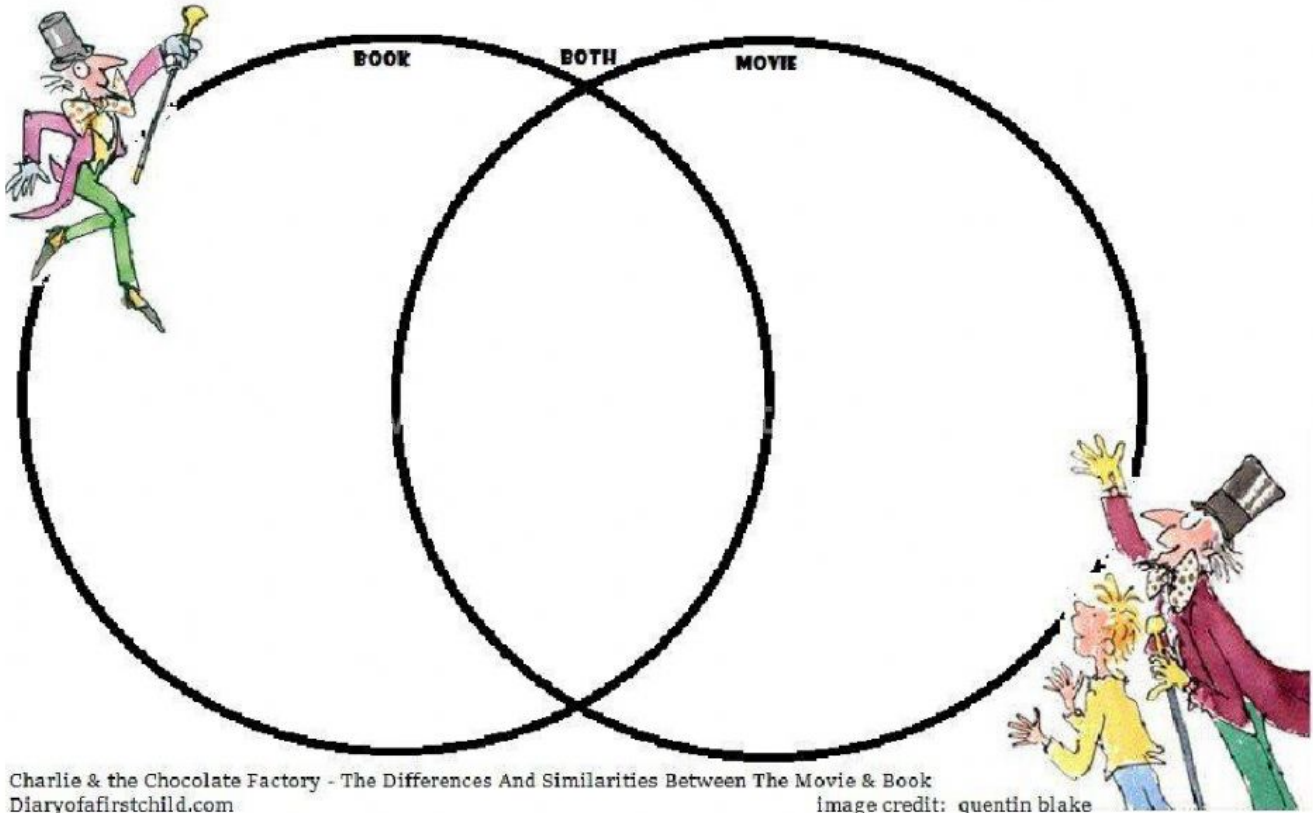
4) Compare the two settings. To compare we can use different structures.
