

READ THE INFORMATION, LOOK AT THE EXAMPLES AND DO THE ACTIVITIES.

Many of the phrasal verbs take an object. Most of the cases, the particle, the second word of the phrasal verb, may come before or after the object if it isn't an object pronoun. If it is an object pronoun (me/ you/ it/ her/ him/ them/us), it is always going to be in the middle.

This can happen just with separable phrasal verbs.

Alice picked up **her children** from school.

Alice picked **her children** up from school.

Dan woke up **his dad** before the match.

Dan woke **his dad** up before the match.

Alice picked **them** up from school.

Dan woke **him** up before the match.
