Ada Lovelace

(1815–1852)



As a young child, Ada Lovelace was very good at Maths and Languages (English and French). She didn't go to university, but she studied Maths with a professor from the University of London. He died in the USA in 2010.

Gertrude Jekyll Gardener (1843–1932)



Gertrude Jekyll was a famous gardener.

Women didn't usually go to university in the 1800s, but in 1861, Jekyll went to the South Kensington School of Art in London. After studying Art, she visited lots of different countries. She painted and she learned about flowers, trees and gardens.

In the 1880s, Jekyll became a garden designer. She designed about 400 gardens in the UK, Europe and the USA. Jekyll didn't marry and she didn't have any children. She died in 1932, at the age of 89.
