

Present Perfect

(PRONOUN + HAVE/HAS + PAST PARTICIPLE)

AFFIRMATIVE

I **have** played = Yo **he jugado**

You **have** played

He **has** played

She **has** played

It **has** played

We **have** played

You **have** played

They **have** played

NEGATIVE

I **haven't** played = Yo **no he jugado**

You **haven't** played

He **hasn't** played

She **hasn't** played

It **hasn't** played

We **haven't** played

You **haven't** played

They **haven't** played

INTERROGATIVE

Have I played? = ¿He jugado?

Have you played?

Has he played?

Has she played?

Has it played?

Have we played?

Have you played?

Have they played?

3rd Person

He
She
It

has

Answers

Yes, I **have**. / No, I **haven't**

Yes, she **has**. / No, she **hasn't**

THE PRESENT PERFECT



Present Perfect

regular verbs

 + have, has + Ved/d

 + haven't, hasn't + Ved/d

(WH) have, has +  + Ved/d

Ved/d = Past Participle (reg. verbs):

+ -ed/-d at the end of the verb
